How Fire Safe Is Our Community?

How fire safe is our community? What can you do to increase the chance that your home can be protected in the event of a wildfire?

The chance that a structure will withstand a wildland fire is greatly improved when the property around it is adequately prepared. With that idea in mind, in 2011, through the efforts of Jeanette Clark and others, GCHNA partnered with the Firesafe

Council of Nevada County and earned Firewise Community/USA recognition. It means that we have committed to encouraging action that minimizes home loss to wildfire.

Each year GCHNA develops an Action Plan to fulfill our responsibility to maintain this Firewise Community designation. This plan is included in this newsletter. We want our members to know about the services available through the Firesafe Council (www.areyoufiresafe) like the free

one-on-one consultation to help homeowners comply with defensible space requirements defined later in this article. Check out the article on Creating Defensible Space Zones on the website for specific steps to consider. Fuels reduction efforts in our area are critical. Scotch Broom is a highly flammable invasive plant. The first GCHNA-sponsored Scotch Broom Pull occurred on April 4 and cleared sites along the county road right of way. Is there Scotch Broom growing on your property? Stop it now. Below is a summary of an article submitted by Cal-Fire to the Union about the defensible space guidelines for our community. Each of us has a responsibility to do as much as we can to prepare for a fire occurrence.

CAL-FIRE: CREATE DEFENSIBLE SPACE AROUND YOUR HOME Inspectors from Cal Fire will be conducting defensible space inspections in Nevada County. "We live in an area where fire risk is already very high and with the drought, this year is on track to be a challenging fire season," said Nevada-Yuba-Placer Chief Brad Harris. "Creating and maintaining defensible space is critical for the protection of homes." Defensible space inspections are supported by the State Responsibility Area Fire Prevention Fee, which is an annual fee assessed to rural residents for fire prevention services. California Public Resources Code 4291 requires homeowners living in our area to maintain 100 feet of defensible space around structures. Cal Fire inspectors will be educating residents and evaluating properties to make sure they are in compliance with state law. Here are some tips that can help



- Remove all flammable vegetation 30 feet from all structures.
- In an additional 70 feet, space trees and plants away from each other.
- Clear all needles and leaves from roofs, eaves and rain gutters.
- Trim branches 6 feet from the ground.
- Use trimming, mowing and power equipment before 10 am and after 6 pm.
- Landscape with fire resistant plants.
- Use fire ignition resistant building material.

GCHNA volunteers are needed. Fire Safe Committee: Susan Wiesner has drafted the GCHNA Firewise Communities Action Plan for 2014-15 (included in this newsletter) and it has been reviewed. There is agreement that all the provisions are possible. The 2 "Firewise Community" signs presented to GCHNA by the FireSafe Council have yet to be displayed. Ellen Hagan will contact the County Planning Dept to find out the procedure for putting them up. FONA: The 2014 executive committee consists of: President, Bob Goar; Vice President, Terry Wagner; Secretary, Don Besse; and Treasurer, Marty Pezzaglia.

NID: The CHCFD Guide Booklet is available from the NID website. Website: Alana Lucia is using Word Press to update the website with the help of Kat Scholtz. Ideas to encourage greater use of the website include posting the waste management schedule and making the newsletter available on the website in a pdf file.

OLD BUSINESS

Providing our members with information on home security has been discussed. Uli Paulin will contact the Sheriff for data on security problems in our neighborhood. A meeting to share this information and prevention strategies with members will be considered.

Alana Lucia was voted unanimously as our new rep for Lower Cement Hill Road. A person still is needed to represent Crystal View Heights including Golden Oaks.

NEW BUSINESS

In 2014 it will coordinate an event focused on clearing this invasive and flammable plant along the sides Cement Hill Road which is a critical neighborhood evacuation route.
- 3) GCHNA will distribute via its periodic newsletter to mem-

- bers and non-members an area map showing emergency access roads designated by Nevada County's Office of Emergency Services (OES) Evacuation Plan.
- 4) GCHNA will continue to provide Firewise Community Concept information to its members and non-members at annual spring and fall events.
- 5) GCHNA regularly encourages its members and non-members to enroll and to actively engage in the FSCNC's Defensible Space Advisory Training program.
- 6) The FSCNC has numerous programs to support fuels reduction efforts in our community. GCHNA will continue to promote such programs including its Chipping Program.
- GCHNA will continue to distribute Firewise, Office of Emergency Services, Cal-Fire and FSCNC educational materials to new residents.
- 8) GCHNA will include in its annual budget funds for continuing membership in the FSCNC.

GCHNA'S Scotch Broom Pull - A Success!

Joanne Drummond summed it up. "It's hard to believe how much fun hard work can be when it's so productive."

On April 4, GCHNA sponsored its first Scotch Broom Pull removing Scotch Broom from a mile long stretch of Cement Hill Road beginning at its junction with Indian Flat. Scotch Broom is a highly flammable, invasive weed and limiting its spread makes our neighborhood more firesafe.

The day was gray and drizzly, but the intrepid GCHNA members and Americorps workers who braved the cold did a fabulous job. GCHNA members included: Susan Wiesner and Ted Smith, Carl Plaza, Eve Collins, Ellen Hagan, Terry Wagner, Allison Miller, and Vicki Vasques. Aviva Fiska represented Sierra Streams Institute. The seven young, strong Americorps workers supplied by the FireSafe Council did much of the pulling and were amazing. Thank you to Elijah Adams from Rochelle, Texas; Lauren Williams from Seattle, Washington; Rebecca Lyons from Baltimore, Maryland; Abel Vega from Houston, Texas; Ben Voisine-Addis from Kennebunk, Maine; Angie Klemm from Fort Worth, Texas, and Kaitlyn Breaux from Port Byron, Illinois.

Thank you to Susan Wiesner and Carl Plaza for organizing the event. Thanks to Eve Collins and Ellen Hagan for refreshments. Thank you to Wally and Marilyn Bair for the use of their pickup truck. The FireSafe Council was extremely helpful providing weed wrenches, loppers, and bright safety vests. Sheriff's Department volunteers provided traffic control. Have you Scotch Broom on your

property? If you do, you've probably

watched it spread. Were it to catch fire, it would burn easily and spread flames to other plants. GCHNA members can borrow a weed wrench from the FireSafe Council. Think about pulling your Scotch Broom this spring.

Keep Water Rates Low - Conserve

Lesa Osterholm, a spokesperson for NID, stressed at a recent FONA meeting the need for water efficiency. With the meager snow pack this year, general changes in weather patterns, and limited water storage capabilities, water conservation becomes a must for everyone.

NID is not selling any surplus water. A severe drought would severely impact local water supply. If Nevada County water users, including those on wells, can conserve 20% of our water usage, NID believes they will have enough for everyone. If it becomes necessary for NID to buy water from P G & E, then water rates could rise.

So, GCHNA members, let's do our part. Check for leaks in your water system indoors and out. At 1 drip per second, a faucet can leak 3,000 gallons per year. Repairs can often be as simple as replacing a washer or a flapper in the toilet. About 50% of water use is for landscaping. Use drip irrigation to water directly where it is needed, don't overwater, and use mulch. Visit www.nidwater.com for more water saving tips and try the "Water Calculator" link to determine your home's water usage.
